

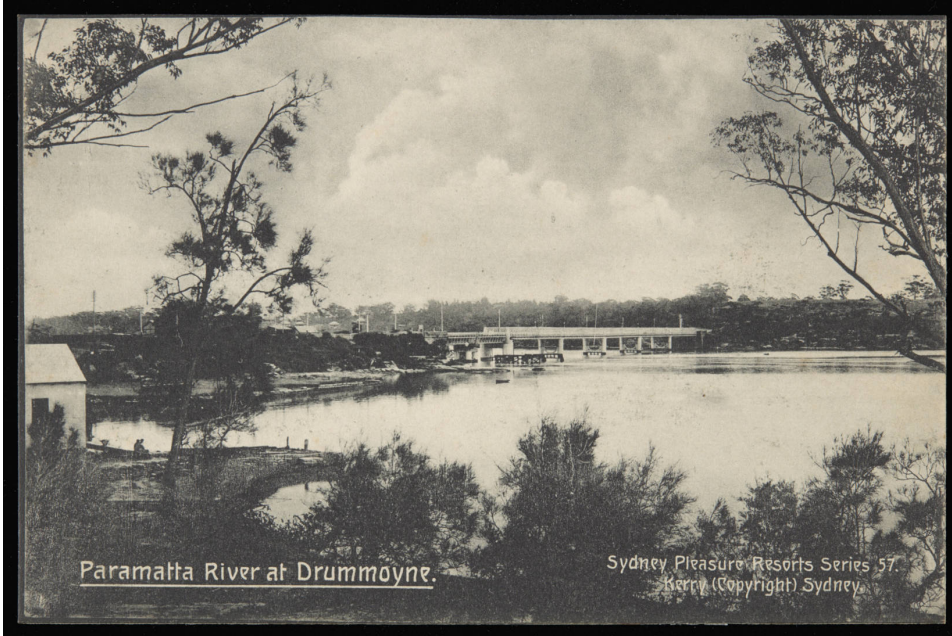

The Drummoyne Bridge was built in 1881 and had an opening span to let vessels on the Parramatta River pass through.
